MEMORDANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

BETWEEN: Her Majesty in Right of Canada, as represented by the Department of Transport (hereinafter referred to as "Transport Canada")

AND: CANADA – NOVA SCOTIA OFFSHORE PETROLEUM BOARD, (hereinafter referred to as the "CNSOPB")

(together referred to as the "Participants")

WHEREAS Transport Canada has responsibility for regulating marine security and issuing security certificates for any marine installation pursuant to the *Marine Transportation Security Act* and regulations made thereunder, and is responsible for ensuring compliance with the *International Ship and Port Facility Security Code*, of the International Maritime Organization;

AND WHEREAS pursuant to the federal Canada-Nova Scotia Offshore Petroleum Resources Implementation Act, (S.C. 1988, c. 28) and the provincial Canada-Nova Scotia Offshore Petroleum Resources Accord Implementation (Nova Scotia) Act (S.N.S. 1987, c.3); both hereinafter referred to as the Accord Acts, the CNSOPB is responsible for regulating safety on offshore oil and gas facilities operating in the Nova Scotia Offshore Area;

AND WHEREAS the CNSOPB has authority pursuant to section 40 of the **Accord Acts** to conclude with the appropriate departments of the Government of Canada, memorandum of understanding to ensure the effective co-ordination of activities and to avoid duplication of work; and

AND WHEREAS in accordance with the Government of Canada's 2007 Cabinet Directive on Streamlining Regulation, it is desirable that both Transport Canada and the CNSOPB pursue coordination and cooperation in areas of mutual interest while maintaining their respective independence.

THE PARTICIPANTS ARE GUIDED BY THEIR COMMON DESIRE TO COORDINATE THEIR ACTIVITIES AS WELL AS COOPERATE AND CONSULT FOR THE PURPOSES OF PROMOTING MARINE SECURITY IN THE NOVA SCOTIA OFFSHORE AREA.

THE PARTICIPANTS HAVE REACHED THE FOLLOWING UNDERSTANDING:

1. This Memorandum of Understanding is not legally binding and places no obligations on the Participants. However, it represents a definite expression and record of the Participants' mutual desire to cooperate in pursuit of shared marine security goals.

- 2. The Participants concur to share relevant marine security information, consult and cooperate as appropriate for the purpose of detection, identification and addressing potential security threats to the Nova Scotia Offshore Area, pursuant to Annex A to this Memorandum of Understanding.
- **3.** The Participants will retain the confidentiality of the information shared under this Memorandum of Understanding and will not disclose or allow such information to be disclosed without consent of the other, unless otherwise requested by law, and will inform the other immediately on becoming aware or suspecting that an unauthorized person has become aware of such information.
- 4. This Memorandum of Understanding may be amended in writing with the consent of both Participants.
- 5. Either Participant may terminate this Memorandum of Understanding after a three months written notice given to the other party.
- 6. This Memorandum of Understanding becomes effective on the date of the latest signature.
